



WELCOME TO THE 2012 RESERVE OFFICER APPLICATION AND HIRING PROCESS

Currently we are accepting applications for 2012 summer season. I would encourage anyone interested to click on the links below for an application, list of required documents and background booklet and submit them as soon as possible. Our review process will begin soon.

Many questions about eligibility are often asked. I have attempted to answer the most frequently asked below.

You must be 20 years of age with 40 college credits and currently enrolled in higher education. If not currently enrolled, you must have 60 college credits. If an applicant is 21 years of age, no college credits are required.

A passing MCJA Physical Agility and Alert Test score is required for employment. This is a **statewide mandatory requirement** for all law officers. We will be offering testing during our hiring process. However, you can contact the academy for testing at any time. The PT testing can be taken in conjunction with the Alert testing. Contact the Maine Criminal Justice Academy at 877-800 for scheduled test dates.

A valid driver's license is required as well as a high school diploma or equivalent.

The Law Enforcement Pre-service School (LEPS) is not required but preferred. If hired, we will sponsor your enrollment into this training course (Phase I and II). I do encourage applicants to contact the Maine Criminal Justice Academy at 207-877-8000 and complete Phase I if possible.

Prior experience is not required but preferred. Our program is designed to provide all required training for those without experience.

Our department takes pride in our Reserve Officer program. This opportunity provides experience to those career minded individuals to gain experience and prepare for their future. Our program seeks the highest quality individual to fill these positions and focuses on professional performance. After reviewing the applications, we will be contacting you in February for scheduling of the oral interviews and further testing.
