## TOWN OF OLD ORCHARD BEACH TOWN COUNCIL WORKSHOP Tuesday, June 29, 2010 TOWN HALL CHAMBERS

A Town Council Workshop of the Old Orchard Beach Town Council was held on Tuesday, June 29, 2010 in the Town Hall Chamber. The Chair opened the meeting at 7:10 p.m. The purpose of the Workshop was to present an opportunity for the Council to review the fiscal 2010/2011 budget.

There were department heads in attendance at the meeting.

Discussion continued as the Council reviewed the past Budget Workshops. It was indicated that a \$15.2 million dollar budget would increase taxes by about \$.50, bringing the proposed tax rate to \$13.44 per \$1,000 of assessed valuation. It was indicated that the Council had agreed, at least by consensus on more than \$500,000 in cuts during the last Workshop and also increased parking fees this summer as well as an increased effort to collect on ambulance bills. It was noted that the Council this evening could make further cuts to the budget, add money or make any other combination of adjustments that would affect the tax rate charged to property owners. Below is the result of the previous workshop. The Town Manager indicated that the school spending was reduced by a total of \$70,000 and the Town's share of cost to redo the intersection of Saco Avenue and E. Emerson Cummings Boulevard was reduced by about \$41,000.

A \$24.5 million combined municipal and school budget has been approved for fiscal year 2010-2011. The budget will increase the mill rate by \$.47 cents because although this budget is a decrease from that of last year, town revenues are down. The Town must also cover the rising costs of Maine Municipal health Insurance and the Maine State Retirement. The municipal budget when discussed at the workshop appeared to have a 3 to 2 in favor of the tax increase; Councilors Bolduc and Chair MacDonald voting against and Councilors O'Neill, Dayton and Vice Chair Tousignant indicating they would vote for it in the Special Town Council Meeting to follow. The \$250,000 from the Waste Water budget was also used in projecting the budget. Councilor Bolduc indicated she did not support it because she said that the Town needed to work on downsizing its government to save money. The budget uses \$500,000 from the reserve fund. An earlier draft used about \$700,000 from the undesignated fund but by increasing the tax rate that Town would not have to use so much of its reserve. Both Councilors O'Neill and Vice Chair Tousignant indicated they did not want a tax increase but felt it was necessary and would help the next Council to face the heavy financial demands on them as well. Councilor O'Neill indicated that he felt using \$700,000 from the undesignated fund balance was too extravagant. He indicated that was our "rainy day" fund. Vice Chair Tousignant indicated that the Council had done a diligent job looking through the budget with fiduciary responsibility. Both were concerned that the infrastructure projects the Town needs to address will continue to put challenges on next year's budget.

A number of citizens expressed their ideas and opinions on a various number of issues from no tax increase considering the lack of services to <u>all</u> citizens as expressed by Jerome Beggart. The suggestion by the Charter Review Commissioner Ladakakos that the Department Heads be made to cut their budgets was responded to by the Chair and the Town Manager who indicated that the Department Heads had more than cut their budgets and were responsible for presenting to the Council the two scenarios including the \$700,000 scenario and the \$1.4 million dollar scenario. Other speakers added their opinions including Fred Dolgan who encouraged consideration of economic times and how it reflected on the citizen's ability to pay. Ricki Letowt spent some time questioning the way the total undesignated fund is handled and there was continued discussion and explanation by the Finance Director on the actual understanding of that account. She indicated that if

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the Town had increased taxes just ten cents a year over the past several years, this rate increase would not have been so painful. Arlene Dolgan and Nancy Tate both spoke of gratefulness to the Council for the approval of the contract with a local shelter for the care and keeping of the Town's animal population.

Discussions between the Council members themselves was supportive but all Council members indicated that the next year's budget will be more difficult than the one that we have currently dealt with and as such the question was raised of an increase in the tax rate which originally had been \$1.10 and now because of Council planning was down to the \$.35 cent to \$40 cent range that perhaps \$.45 cents would allow some of the money to be made available in the planning for next year's budget when school monies will not be available as they were this year and questions of how revenues will be coming in is something that could not be determined. A consensus was suggested between Councilor Dayton, O'Neill and Vice Chair Tousignant to go with the \$.45 tax increase.
