During the past year there have been several changes of teachers, including the two upper schools. In the First Grammar and High school, in accordance with a vote of the town, that a male teacher should be employed, Miss Ida B. Newhall gave place, at the close of the winter term, to Mr. G. B. Littleffeld, this being his first school. He retired at the close of the Spring term. The Fall term was begun under the instruction of Mr. Howard P. Haines of Saco, who left at the close of the first week to fill another engagement previously made. Since that time these departments have been in charge of Mr. Edgar Yates, as Principal, an experienced and successful instructor, who had previously taught here. In the First Grammar grade, as in the higher studies, the progress made has been systematic, thorough and rapid. In the Intermediate and Second Grammar grades, Mrs. Anna E. Fisk retired at the end of the winter term, in favor of Miss Emma Haines, this being her first effort at teaching. The Primary department, which has been taught with success, by Mrs. Mary W. Means, for the past three years, has been continued without

change through the year, with the usual excellent results. One lack of our schools has been that of a graded course of study. 'To get the best results from the few years' study allotted to our children, system is absolutely necessary. This I have undertaken to bring about the past year, by the introduction of a regularly graded course of study, which takes the pupil at the entrance of the primary department and carries him steadily up grade until the exit is made from the High school department. To do this successfully and give pupils all the work they ought to do, no more and no less, on the best educational lines, is no small undertaking. With what skill I may possess, supplemented by the experience of others, I prepared a "Course of Study" which was put into the hands of teachers and pupils to work by, beginning with the September term. has proved a gratifying success. Under this system the pupils get four years' study in the Primary grade, three years in the Second Grammar grade, two years in the First Grammar grade and a two years' High school course. In doing this the grade has been raised slightly and one year added to the Grammar school course in the upper room, thus giving a full four years' course in the Grammar grade, and placing it side by side with the best regulated schools of this grade in the State.

The present system suggests another change which can be made at a small additional expense to the town, namely, the extension of the High school course from two to four years. The reason is obvious: The larger part of the students who take our present two years' High School course desire to complete their studies, and to do so they are compelled to go from home and incur a large extra expense. This should be remedied. We as a town are abundantly able to educate our own children. Whatever else Old Orchard may do in relation to its finances it cannot afford to deal sparingly with its public schools. Communities, cities and towns, ranked relatively and collectively by the school privileges they afford. The best schools centralize the best morality, the highest intelligence and the largest investments of capital.

It is a matter of regret that parents do not take sufficient interest in our schools to visit them frequently. It is not only their privilege but their plain duty to know from actual observation the character of the schools and what progress their children are making in them. It gives new life and energy to the teacher's efforts and stimulates the scholars to renewed activity to be made thus to realize that the fathers and mothers of the town take a personal interest in them and their work.

In common with the schools of the whole land the four hundredth anniversary of the Discovery of America, by Christopher Columbus, was fittingly observed by the schools of this town, on the 20th of October, 1892. Through the liberality of our citizens a 50-foot flagstaff was erected on the school grounds, and a handsome flag, purchased by the scholars themselves, now floats to the breeze during school hours, as an emblem of the Nation's honor and an inspiration to patriotism and love of country.

#### WARRANT FOR

## Annual Town Meeting,

MARCH 6th, 1893.

To Elmer E. Googins, Constable of the Town of Old Orchard, in the County of York,

Greeting:

In the name of the State of Maine, you are hereby required to notify and warn the inhabitants of said Town of Old Orchard, qualified by law to vote in town affairs, to assemble at Porter's Hall in said Town, on Monday, the sixth day of March, A. D., 1893, at 10 o'clock in the forenoon, then and there to act upon the following articles, to wit:

1st To choose a moderator to preside at said meeting.

2nd—To choose all necessary town officers for the year ensuing.

3rd—To hear and act upon the report of the town officers and all standing and special committees.

4th—To see what action the town will take in relation to pay of town officers.

5th—To see what sum of money the town will raise, 1st, for common schools; 2nd, free high school; 3rd, for free text books; 4th, making and repairing highways and bridges; 5th, support of poor; 6th, pay of town officers; 7th, maintaining street lights and electric lights; 8th, contingent expenses; 9th, sanitary expenses; 10th, interest.

6th—To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise to pay collector's commissions, abatements and discounts.

7th—To see what compensation the town will vote to pay the Collector for collecting taxes, for all moneys actually collected.

8th—To see if the town will vote when the taxes shall be committed to the Collector for collection, and what discount shall be allowed on both town and special, if paid within a given date, and charge interest thereon, thereafter.

9th—To see if the town will authorize the Selectmen and Treasurer to hire money in anticipation of taxes and not exceed the same.

10th-To see if the town will authorize the Selectmen and Treasurer to issue town notes, to pay those which fall due the present year.

11th-To see if the town will authorize the school agent to

employ the school teachers.

12th—To see if the town will authorize the assessors to make such abatements as they think reasonable.

13th-To see if the town will vote to set out and replace such shade trees as the Selectmen deem expedient, not to exceed the sum of 5 per cent. of the amount appropriated for highways.

14th-To see if the town will authorize the Selectmen to contract with some Electric Lighting company, for lighting for a term of years, the streets and public buildings in said town.

15th-To see if the town will vote to widen Washington Ave., as petitioned by Daniel Campbell and others, from Highland Ave. to Atlantic Ave.; 2nd, to see what sum of money the town will vote to appropriate for land damages.

16th—To see what part of the year the town will authorize

the streets lighted.

17th—To see what sum of money the town will raise to reduce the principal of the debt on account of new school house.

18th-To see if the town will vote to accept Sixteenth street as per Dennett's plan, petitioned by I. J. Brown and others.

19th-To see if the town will vote to accept Pine Ave., as per Dennett's plan of Orchard Beach Association, as laid out

by the Selectmen.

20th-To see if the town will vote to build and construct a sewer beginning at Atlantic Avenue, thence northeasterly through Washington Avenue to Old Orchard road, thence easterly to a point opposite the office of the Old Orchard Water company, thence south easterly through land of E. C. Staples, across land owned by Boston and Maine Railroad, to Grand Avenue sewer, and what sum of money the town will raise therefor, to be a separate tax. to be assessed and collected as provided in Section IV of the Act of Incorporation of the Town of Old Orchard.

21st-To see what action the town will take and what sum of money the town will raise to maintain a police force; construct and maintain sidewalks; to maintain fire department; for hydrant rental; for interest on debt incurred in fire department, sewers and loan, all within the limits set out in Section IV of the Act of Incorporation of the Town of Old Orchard, to be a separate tax, to be assessed and collected as provided in said Act.

The Selectmen hereby give notice that they will be in session at the ante-room of Odd Fellows hall, for the purpose of revising and correcting the voting list on the morning of election from 8 to 10 o'clock, a. m.
