Town Information:

- While we are all hopeful that the pandemic is starting to get more manageable we want you to remember about these two resources. The Vaccine Information Line is available for residents to call Monday through Friday from 8–5. The number is 866-962-6062. This is NOT to schedule vaccine appointments but to provide answers to questions you may have about the vaccine. Also OOB residents can still call the OOB COVID ASSISTANCE LINE, staffed from 9AM to 3PM Monday through Friday, to assist you with any non-emergency needs. That number is 934-0860.
