Employees are completing many of the mandatory annual training videos.

Reports to: Operations Manager

Skills required: Many and varied; strong oral communication & people skills are highly desired.

Qualifications: Minimum of 15 years old (must have a work permit if required).

Physical demands: Ability to stand, walk, run and/or sit for extended hours, work outdoor in various weather and various stretches of time.

CODE ENFORCEMENT OFFICER-CEO

Nature of Work: The CEO position plays a key role in planning and zoning, and making sure that building projects are done legally and meet certain safety standards.

Reports to: Typically reports to the Town Manager or Town Planner. Also has reporting responsibilities to the town Planning Board of Appeals.

Skills required: A strong interest in, or knowledge of, the construction field is vital. Oral and written communication skills are important too, as this person has extensive contact with the public. Ability to work well under pressure is also desirable.

Qualifications: Graduation from a 2 year vocational program in the building or construction field. A minimum of 5 years of experience in the construction or code enforcement field is desired. Maine State law requires that Code Enforcement Officers complete required training and certification standards within 12 months of starting the job.

Physical demands: Persons in this job are often in the field, on construction job sites or in completed buildings. The ability to operate a motor vehicle, equipment and certain tools is important.

OCEANFRONT LIFEGUARD

Nature of Work: Lifeguards are responsible for keeping the beach safe and clean for visitors. They are constantly watching and adapting to the changes on the beach, with visitors and/or weather.

Reports to: Through the chain of command to a Lifeguard Captain, Deputy Fire Chief or Fire Chief.

Skills required: Must be able to respond quickly to unanticipated events and perform well under pressure. Also important: strong ocean swimming skills, strong interpersonal and speaking skills, and working well with others.

Qualifications: Minimum age of 18, must be a Maine Certified Lifeguard, certified in CPR and First Aid, and must pass a swim and fitness test.

Physical demands: Depending on situations, may have to run various distances, swim various distances in changing tides, use rescue equipment such as, kayaks, boards, etc.

Qualifications: High school diploma or equivalency, must be a Maine Certified Firefighter 1, EMT-Advanced or EMT-Paramedic certification preferred.

Physical demands: Depending on the exact job, can include operation of fire-suppression equipment, medical equipment and emergency response vehicles.
