Goosefare Testing

Dave Walker of OP samples Goosefare for bacteria levels.

DId we follow up after smoke testing and dye testing? DPW has the data. Someone has to follow up and enforce. Kimbark will contact Meghan from Maine Healthy Beaches; what has happened? Did letters go out to homeowners? What needs to happen next?

Phragmites

Kimbark talked to Stantec and DEP; we can't use the remaining money in other marshes in OOB. We have spent \$23,000 out of \$40,000. We can apply it in Randall Marsh for replacement plantings with DEP approval. Kimbark will follow up. Check on East Grand this summer. Students can plant in fall.

Milliken Mills

Subcommittee will form and make a plan for North Trail. Roger wants to help! Milliken Mills May 18, 19 -- Mark will clean Milliken Mills Trails.
