

Update for February 14th, 2021

Town Information:

- The What's Up OOB line is adding new information today February 14th but we want to be sure that during the upcoming winter months OOB residents remember they can call the OOB COVID ASSISTANCE LINE, staffed from 9AM to 3PM Monday through Friday, to assist you with any non-emergency needs. The number is 934-0860.
- The Vaccine Information Line is available for residents to call Monday through Friday from 8–5. The number is 866-962-6062. This is NOT to schedule vaccine appointments but to provide answers to questions you may have about the vaccine. Some examples of questions commonly asked are: What phase am I in? What high-risk medical conditions qualify for Phase 1B? I have allergies should I still get a vaccine?
- There will be a Food Box delivery on Thursday February 25th at the Ballpark from 10-12 or until the boxes are gone. Boxes will be placed in your car trunk directly from the pallets so delivery will be contactless. Boxes include meat, protein, produce, and dairy, including a gallon of milk. - The new message board is up and running at the Town Hall! This is one more way for OOB residents to get information about what is happening here in town. Check it out next time you are downtown.
- The Rec Department has been working hard and now thanks to a group of dedicated volunteers there is an outdoor activity area open at the Ballpark from 9AM-9PM. The complex has lights and includes a small skating rink for beginners, pond skating for everyone, with ½ the ice dedicated to hockey! The family picnic area and Storyboard Walk remain open. Dogs are welcome but please be sure to pick up after your furry family member. Beginning on Wednesday 2/17 snowshoes will be available to borrow from 9-3 at the clubhouse.
