TOWN MANAGER'S REPORT

The Town Manager reported that two properties that will be put out for sale – 19 Fern Avenue and 13 Melvin Street - will not be done until after the election because Old Orchard Voters will consider whether to change the Charter to allow surplus Town property to be sold through auction or other competitive processes. He met with the Chamber of Commerce and several local businesses that employ J-1 students to discuss both housing availability and how to assist J-1 students in having a positive experience in Old Orchard Beach. Numbers have grown from 470 students to almost 800 students coming to this area in the past two years, resulting in greater difficulties in locating housing. The Town and Chamber are jointly surveying local businesses to identify which ones employed J-1 students this year and which ones plan to employ them next year. He also reported on attending the grand opening celebration for the Milliken Mills Trails on Portland Avenue. The sixth graders from Loranger School were on hand along with many residents to explore the new trails that are on both sides of Portland Avenue. Kimbark Smith, the Chair of the Conservation Committee, presided over the festivities and thanked the many people who have worked for the past two years to create the trails, especially the Conservation Committee members and the students at Jameson and Loranger School. You can go to the CC face book page for information. The trail head is located next to the entrance of the former Kennel on Portland Avenue. Town Hall entrances are getting spruced up. Fresh paint on doors and trim and the steps will be replaced at the entrance on Old Orchard Street. DPW doing the work. The Planning Board approved a 40 unit subdivision on the former seasonal Catholic Church on Saco Avenue. The Town Manager met twice with the Firefighters Union and held an initial meeting with the new bargaining unit representing Town Hall administrative support staff. He also reported on a meeting he attended on street lights. This workshop addressed town ownership of street lights. Maine Law changed this year to make this more feasible and more economically viable. Falmouth,

Rockland, South Portland and Biddeford have collaborated on a joint RFP to implement this changeover. According to the information at the work session there is a savings of almost \$90 per fixture; even after putting money aside for maintenance and replacement. If that is true, Old Orchard Beach would see a savings of about \$100,000 per year, and have better lighting. There is an up-front capital cost of course that would be over \$600,000, but the payback on the investment is six years, after which the savings are gravy and it is worth looking into.

West Grand Avenue. Also, thirty-minute parking shall be allowed on the ocean side from Union Avenue to Ocean Avenue for 20 feet on both sides of West Grand Avenue from Union Avenue. Loading and unloading only may be permitted within 50 feet of commercial establishments if not in conflict with other provisions of this chapter. Signs shall be erected and will define such areas at the designation of the chief of police. Parking shall be allowed on the ocean side of West Grand Avenue from Staples Street to Fourth Street commencing on September 15 and ending on May 1 of each year.

BACKGROUND:

The Public Works Department went out for a proposal from consultants to develop a comprehensive drainage study. Proposals were received from the following:

Wright Pierce Engineering	\$39,150.00

Underwood Engineers, Inc. \$31,400.00

Ransom Consulting, Inc. \$39,998.20

Walsh Engineering Associates, Inc. \$46,000.00

This process was set up as Qualification Based Selection (QBS). Fees for each proposal were submitted in a separate envelope to be opened after the proposal review. It was recommended that the selection criteria for the proposals be:

Project Approach 40% Project Team 40%

Cost 20%

The Selection Committee was selected and included the following:

Town Manager Larry Mead
Public Works Director Marc Guimont

The overall goal of this project is to assess the capacity for growth and the constraints on growth given the hydrology dynamics of the open-and-closed stormwater systems. The total land area of Old Orchard Beach must be considered, public and private. The Town has allocated \$40,000 for this study. It was noted that all data is in an ESRI File Geodatabase, Maine State Plane Coordinates, West Zone, NAD83, and U.S. Survey feet. It was recommended that contact be made with Thomas Burns of GIS Mapping and analysis for further information

on data. Data transmission of this format was listed as preferable. It should be noted that the Dunegrass development is included to the extent that Dunegrass discharges storm water into the Town's drainage system.

RE: AGENDA ITEM #6808; WRIGHT PIERCE TO DO DRAINAGE STUDY

This agenda item would approve contracting with Wright Pierce Engineering to develop a Comprehensive Drainage Study and Report for the Town at a cost of \$39,150. This project was approved as part of the FY17 Capital Budget and there are sufficient funds available. The comprehensive drainage study will identify the current capacities and serviceability for storm water flows, areas where capacity is seriously deficient, assess existing infrastructure capabilities, and recommend upgrades to accommodate existing needs as well as future development.

The Town received proposals from four firms. A selection committee consisting of DPW Director Marc Guimont, Assistant Planner Megan McLaughlin, Senior Vice President Barry Sheff from Woodard/Curran Engineering and the Town Manager reviewed the proposals. The committee interviewed three firms; Wright Pierce, Underwood Engineering, and Ransom Engineering. The committee determined that the fourth proposal from Walsh Engineering did not warrant further consideration.

Based on the review of the submitted proposals and the interview and discussion with the three firms selected for final review the selection committee was unanimous in selecting Wright-Pierce as the project consultant.

- Wright Pierce has completed similar town wide studies for Wakefield, MA, Rye, NH, and for Richmond, ME, as well as other municipal drainage studies for watershed areas in Topsham, ME, and Weston, MA.
- Wright Pierce proposes to utilize software that addresses both hydraulic and hydrological assessments and analysis and it has the staffing capabilities to perform the work.
- Wright Pierce was the highest rated proposer in both its Project Approach (understanding of project goals, method of analysis, work products) and Project Team (documented experience, quality of interview, complimentary skills set among team members).
- Because of its long association with the Town of Old Orchard Beach Wright Pierce has a broad knowledge of the Town's infrastructure strengths and weaknesses and the issues related to storm water management in various locations and neighborhoods.

For these reasons staff recommends utilizing Wright Pierce for the drainage study.

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


