## IN MEMORIAM

### Thomas B. Mullen

Thomas B. Mullen, who moved to Old Orchard Beach (then Old Orchard) in the year 1906, from Lewiston, Maine, died at the Bean Convalescent Home in Saco, Maine, December 21, 1950 at the age of 76.

At the time of his death he was holding a residence on Staples Street; being more or less connected in the real estate business, he had held residences on Adelaide Road and on Mullen Avenue, which Avenue was named for him; where he at one time held several real estate properties.

Mr. Mullen was always interested in and took a prominent part in the activities and upbuilding and welfare of his adopted town, and for several years occupied the position of Chairman of the Board of Health, and as Health Officer, and in that connection was a Special Police Officer. He was a faithful communicant of St. Margaret's Church. He was buried in Mt. Hope Cemetery, Lewiston, Maine.

## MANAGER'S REPORT

The manager plan has been in effect in Old Orchard Beach for a period of nine months to December 31, 1950. During the year many changes have taken place. One of the major changes is in the number of members of the Board of Selectmen. The Board of Selectmen consists of five members instead of three as under the old form. The Board and the town meeting are the policy makers for the town. After the policy has been decided it becomes the duty of the manager to administer the policy as smoothly and efficiently as possible. Understanding and cooperation between the Board of Selectmen and the Manager are of greatest importance. Both are working toward the same end: better and more efficient government for you. The selectmen determine within the mandate of town meeting what needs to be done: the manager determines the best way to carry out these policies.

The creation of a Public Works Department has resulted in more efficient service to our citizens. The functions of the highway, sanitation, sewer, snow removal and other related functions have been combined under one department. This allows for greater utilization of manpower and equipment. The department is under the supervision of a foreman who takes his orders from the manager, the personnel of the department are used in whatever capacity necessary to get the maximum for our money. At no time is equipment or men idle. The services of the Sanitation functions has been increased to cover areas not serviced before: namely Millikens Mills, Cascade Road and other parts of Portland Avenue. The overdraft in this department as will

be shown further in this report was \$82.76 as against \$3,674.46 last year. A more detail comparison can be seen from figures presented further on in this report. There is at all times a policeman on duty to take advantage of our police car which serves as an ambulance in cases of emergency.

Several changes have been made on the interior of the town hall building. A small office has been constructed for the manager to allow for privacy when one of the citizens comes into the office. The cages have been taken down and a small meeting room made for the use of small groups. The town clerk has a private office so he may keep his records together and easily accessible. The manager acts as clerk to the Board of Selectmen and minutes are kept of all meetings and filed for future reference.

We have added three new units to our two-way radio system. Two in the fire department and one in the Public Works Department. These aid greatly in more efficient and faster service by these departments. With Civilian Defense becoming more and more prominent, they will be of even greater use to our community.

The detail expenditures of all departments are listed in this report. The method of presentation has been changed from previous years. This was done so that at a glance you would know just how the funds were spent. The individual payments are on file in the office should anyone wish a further breakdown.

The town is now receiving revenue from the rubbish that is deposited on the dump thereby reducing the amount of money raised by taxation to support the town

dump. The dump also has been moved about a mile further up the T for Turn road eliminating a bad condition adjacent to our schools.

This report has in general covered the activities and major changes in the town's government. This with the balance of the report will give you a complete picture of this year's operation.

Meetings attended 39.

Many of these meetings are one and two day Institutes through which the nurses receive Education and information in conjunction with advanced methods and procedures in Public Health.

The annual cost analysis was computed and submitted to those affiliating agencies with whom contracts are maintained.

During the past three months the nursing service has been actively participating in the Civil Defense and Public Safety Program, as recommended by the State and Local Directors, "To be equipped to expand its services commensurate with the needs in event of Disaster or War connected epidemics."

The Financial report of this department shows an unexpended balance, due to the fluctuation of remuneration for services, it is difficult to estimate the amount which may be available for extensive replacements of furnishings.

Cupboards for storage and some furnishings are needed, reasonable estimates on this equipment were received too late for disbursement from 1950 funds.

Miss Arlene Masterman, R.N., Graduate of the Maine General Hospital, Training School for Nurses, has served as part time assistant during the year. She was formerly employed at the Maine General Hospital as Ward Supervisor and Assistant Instructor in Nursing Arts.

## REPORT OF SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

To the Superintending School Committee and Citizens  
of Old Orchard Beach:

The annual report of the Public Schools of Old Orchard Beach for the fiscal year ending December 31, 1950 discusses general problems in education briefly, reviews local progress, and concludes with pupil statistics followed by the financial summary.

### 50 ODD YEARS

The turn of a half century may be likened to the seventh inning stretch in a baseball game. We pause a moment to reflect upon the activity just experienced and then our mind is concerned with anticipation towards the unpredictable innings ahead.

The first half of the twentieth century has produced more material progress than any half century recorded in the history of mankind. This progress has had a heavy impact on the development of education during the period. Influences other than material have extended democratic ideas, have overcome the faith of formal mental discipline, have acknowledged the findings of psychologists, and finally have recognized the fact of individual differences.

The field of science—medical, physical, and social—has brought about extraordinary changes in the American scene between the years 1900 and 1950. Improved educational facilities in medical science and sanitation have increased the average life expectancy of the American people from 50 to more than 65 years. Telephone

subscribers have increased from a million and a half to more than forty million and automobile ownership from five thousand in 1900 to again more than forty million in 1950. By the year 1949, 83,000,000 radios and 3,000,000 television sets were in use in the United States. From the first successful airplane flight in 1903, Americans are now logging annually more than nine billion passenger miles. From the beginning of the century and within a span of 40 years, the United States has survived the upheavals of two world wars. Since 1935 the Social Security law has paid beneficiaries the unbelievable amount of 24 billion dollars and many more citizens are to be secured under the new 1950 amendment.

In 1900 there were about 15,000,000 pupils in the public elementary school and secondary schools in this country. In 1950, there were about 25,000,000 and those in secondary schools were 12 times greater than in 1900. It is predicted that in ten years time there will be 34,000,000 in the elementary schools alone and more than 8,000,000 in the secondary schools.

In 1900 the expenditure per pupil in average daily attendance was \$16.88. In 1950 the figure was about \$185.00. Expenditures for school construction has jumped from \$35,000,000 in 1900 to about \$500,000,000 in 1949.

The average annual school term has increased from 144 days to 177 in 1948. During this period, teachers' and supervising officers' average salary in cities over 8,000 persons increased from \$670 in 1900 to \$2,886 in 1950. And now once again a shortage of teachers is anticipated.

That there is confusion in education as in other phases of American life cannot be denied. A materialistic philosophy and international tensions at mid-century will continue to make heavier the task of education tomorrow in the United States.

### BUILDINGS AND GROUNDS

Two additional classrooms were found to be necessary in the fall of 1950 due to very large seventh and eighth grade enrollments. Space for one classroom was provided in the Federal School by taking out partitions in the teachers' room and clinic as well as two toilets. A modern classroom properly lighted and painted was the result. A combination teachers' room and clinic was set up in the original cafeteria kitchen. The value of the building was increased by one classroom which would have cost in the vicinity of \$10,000.00 had this room been annexed to the building. This was managed at a cost to the School Department of only \$2,500.00. The second classroom was arranged by renovation of one of two rooms formerly used as a sub-primary class in the Elementary School.

The Elementary and Old High School housed 11 classes with grades sub-primary through the third in the two buildings. New steps were constructed and some much needed painting was completed in the Old High School. Work was started on the Elementary School roof in effort to correct a snow hazard.

The Federal School, now a ten room building, held classes for the fourth, fifth, and sixth grades as well as two seventh grade groups. All exterior window sash and trim were painted as scheduled for summer work.

The administration of the High School and Annex

was carried on much the same as last year. Room assignments were changed to correct traffic problems. The two second floor annex rooms were scheduled for High School use permitting three eighth grade classes and one seventh to use adjacent rooms at that end of the building on the ground floor. Again, the job of painting window sash and trim was completed on this building.

Considerable improvements of playgrounds and general landscaping were made a part of the summer work projects. Working advantageously with the Street Department, who supplied material and labor at cost, the Federal School yard was made larger and resurfaced.

A start was made on the baseball field project to be completed in the spring of 1951. The preliminary work of grading and removing of obstructions was carried on to the limit of funds available.

Work started during the previous year on a circular driveway around the High School was completed and surfaced including the addition of a parking and play area in the rear of the building. A new lawn was seeded and shrubbery was set at the Annex end of the building following the installation of a connecting sidewalk. This concluded the work of the Building Committee who closed their books on a job well done within the appropriation granted them in March 1949.

### TEACHING PERSONNEL

Few changes occurred in the faculties of the various schools. Mrs. Alice Mason, who moved to Massachusetts, proved to be the only loss to the system. Miss

Sarah Hill of Portland, experienced teacher from the Saco schools, had replaced Mrs. Mason.

Two new teachers were engaged to correct a condition of overcrowding. On the assignment of Mrs. Ella McKenna to a seventh grade in the Federal Building, a vacancy was created in a sub-primary position which was filled by Miss Catherine Merrifield of South Windham. Miss Merrifield had previously taught in Patten. Again, Mrs. Katherine Anderson accepted a new eight grade position leaving a vacancy in the seventh grade. Miss June Watts of Union, a teacher with several years of experience, accepted the appointment to this position in the Federal School.

In line with recent trends, teacher welfare received serious consideration on the part of the Superintending School Committee. Progressive action was taken on the unanimous decision to adopt a teachers' salary schedule. With the schedule being based on background preparation, there is definite encouragement for teachers to continue their studies in their respective fields. To further this interest to the betterment of the Old Orchard Beach Schools, financial aid in the amount of \$50.00 for each summer school attendance was granted by the Committee.

Cost of living adjustments were considered, also, during the late fall and increases were granted ranging from 3 to 7 per cent to be effective at the turn of the new fiscal year. Salaries for the next contract period are to be raised within the limitations of the adopted schedule. In the final analysis, teachers in 1951 will realize a range increase of from 6 to 10 per cent over the 1950 school year.

### THE SCHOOLS AT WORK

**WRITING SYSTEM**—The Rinehart Writing System was adopted in the fall of 1950 in the elementary schools. Improvement has been observed even in the short few months of operation from the viewpoint of both parents and teachers.

**TESTING PROGRAM**—In order to anticipate for guidance purposes the quality of work to be expected from each pupil, mental examinations are given yearly in each of the first, fourth, seventh, and tenth grades. Readiness tests in reading and arithmetic are given yearly in the Sub-Primary classes as well as achievement tests in grades one through eight. Judgment in grade placement is thus supported by actual achievement and academic ability.

**COMMERCIAL COURSE**—A revision in the high school commercial department was made in the fall of 1950 with the addition of a second instructor. A complete curriculum in this field is now offered and it is expected that only qualified pupils will graduate from this four year course of study.

**READING**—Continuous study on reading problems is an activity in progress in the primary grades. In order to remove an earlier hazard of forcing children into reading too soon, formal reading was dropped from the Sub-Primary curriculum. These classes now emphasize a readiness course in reading, arithmetic and social adjustment. A desire to learn to read is created. Oral and sight vocabularies are developed based upon two reading programs continued through the second and third grades.

Phonetic training has been re-introduced in the first three grades as an aid in both reading and spelling.

AUDIO-VISUAL AIDS — Film strip projectors, radios, and sound film machines are now available for each school. Many of the teachers have prepared themselves for this work by taking extension courses in this field recently. Field trips in and out of town have been occurring with greater frequency.

SCHOOL TRAFFIC — Pupil control against the hazard of traffic on Saco Avenue intersections has been definitely improved during the past fall. Former Police Chief Leon Jones organized the program which has been carried on by Chief Lawrence Mitchell.

SCHOOL LUNCH—The new cafeteria in the high school annex has more than proved its value as a necessary adjunct to the over-all program. Under the careful supervision of Mrs. Esther Crowley this program is making a steady growth as more and more take advantage of well balanced lunches.

SCHOOL BAND — The high school band has become a reality and has improved tremendously during the past year. Sponsored by the Old Orchard Beach Band Boosters' Club and directed by Mr. John Trull, a number of fine performances has been presented in addition to their appearances at the fall football games. An all-out effort is being made by the Boosters, under the leadership of Mrs. Arthur Dickson, to procure uniforms for the coming year.

DENTAL CLINIC—The sodium-fluoride treatment sponsored by the Lions Club is one of the outstanding community efforts in the state. The services of dental hygienist, Mrs. Abby Grant, is completely supported by this civic minded organization.

THE P. T. A. — A discussion of the work of the schools of Old Orchard Beach would be incomplete without a comment regarding the Parent-Teachers' Association. Schools are bound to be better organized where parents and teachers work together and this is especially true locally.

The Old Orchard Beach Chapter has been honored this year by having one of their members, Mrs. Theodore Manduca, president of the Maine Congress of Parents and Teachers. Fellow members have been rightfully proud of her outstanding work during her term of office. Once again, they were most pleased to learn late in January of Mrs. Manduca's nomination for the position of vice president, Region 1 of the National Congress of Parents and Teachers.

### LOOKING AHEAD

The actual enrollment curve continues its forecasted upward trend. The impact of the increase will be noticeable next year at the high school level as one of the first large entering classes will appear next fall.

Plans in the very near future should include a modern primary school and gymnasium enlargement.

Facilities for physical education in the high school are lacking. There is no suitable space for dressing and locker rooms for physical education classes. At the moment, our own local athletic teams are forced to turn

over their small dressing rooms to the visiting teams because of the above mentioned lack.

Seating space for athletic games in the gymnasium is limited to 300. The size of the school and the town as well as the interest in the promotion of basketball in Maine circles call for 4 times the present seating area available at the local high school.

### FINANCES

Despite failure of the state to return to Old Orchard Beach anticipated subsidy on the basis of existing laws, the School Department closed their books with a small balance.

Increased cost in education is to be expected and cannot be avoided without jeopardizing the rightful heritage of the children of the community. It cannot be charged fairly that the cost of education in Old Orchard Beach is excessive. According to the latest statistics published by the State Department of Education in January 1951, Old Orchard Beach has a school tax rate of .01712. The state average for the same period is .02630. Local school maintenance on which the above was based is costing 9 mills less than the average of the state. The total cost of education during the past year in Old Orchard Beach represents only 27.6 cents of the tax dollar while many communities in Maine are approaching 50 cents of the tax dollar in school appropriations and some exceed the 50 per cent amount.

In effort to secure additional building funds to take care of future building needs, recent applications have been made by the School Committee for a Federal allocation. Eligibility for this money as yet has not been established.

### 1951 BUDGET

The budget for the next fiscal year has been materially increased. The over-all economic picture explains the necessity quite clearly. The rise in estimated expenses represents an increase of 14.7 per cent. This compares favorably with other near-by towns as a check produced a figure in the vicinity of 20 per cent.

The new writing system and the proposed girls' Physical Education instructor represents the only innovations over last year's planning. Instruction in both these fields has long been needed.

It is interesting to note that personnel services of teachers janitors, and conveyance total 81.9 per cent of the estimated expenses. Repairs, fuel, and supplies are listed at 3.7, 3-1 and 3.7 per cent respectively. Text-books, a major item in the program, account for only 2.4 per cent of the total expense while each of the other items are less than 2 per cent.

### CONCLUSION

Progress is being made educationally in the schools of Old Orchard Beach. Most of the teachers have been relieved of the tensions attending overcrowded conditions. More and more teachers are advancing professionally to the end that your schools will produce a more competent product.

I have appreciated a sympathetic and understanding attitude on the part of the Superintending School Committee as well as the members of the recent Building Committee who have concluded their duties within the current year.

Doctor Skilling, School Physician, commented that he felt that general school health conditions were excellent amongst Old Orchard Beach school children. Physical check-ups are given to the Subprimary group, second, fourth, sixth and eighth grade students, plus new students in all the grades, and any child that the teacher and nurse feels should be seen by the doctor, and the entire High School student body every year.

The School Nurse contacts the family when a condition is found that is making difficulty for a child either mentally, physically or emotionally and in many cases some treatment or care can be found to help the situation and relieve the child.

January-Classes in First Aid were carried on through the Spring term with the Junior High School Eighth Grade group. Practical bandaging, control of bleeding, artificial respiration, cleansing of wounds, etc., were all studied and practiced. An avid interest in snake bites by the boys wasn't as generally enjoyed by the girls.

Forty-eight Red Cross First Aid Certificates were received by the above group.

Classes were also carried in co-operation with the Home Economics teacher in Home Nursing. The subjects of major interest to the Freshmen girls who took these classes—as baby sitting—were considered in planning the class work and any topic of interest pertaining to family life was always welcomed for discussion.

Eighteen Red Cross Home Nursing Certificates were received by this group.

Conferences were carried on through the entire year either individually or in class groups on matters of personal health and hygiene, disease prevention and care, and various problems of interest to the individual or group.

Barring the one case of meningitis which admittedly gave us some anxious moments we have been fortunate in the comparatively light cases of communicable disease that came to us this past year.

Co-operation of the home and the school in watching for signs of illness and isolation of the children showing such symptoms, as cold infections, paid off in the good general health picture. Teachers and parents worked together for the protection of all concerned.

Clinics were held at the Elementary School and at the Town Hall during the past year. The above school children were protected against smallpox and diphtheria by vaccination and toxoid injections. This health protection program is practically 100% with our children and its excellence is brought home to us when we read and hear about sections of our world where such protection has been neglected and diphtheria and smallpox have cropped up once more.

### Patch Tests Against Tuberculosis

Over three hundred Patch tests were given to the Subprimary, grade one, grade eight, new students and High School students during the past year, as a health protection measure. Thirty students had chest x-rays done at the State Diagnostic Clinic held in Biddeford during March 1950. We were happy to find that the x-rays reports in general on the students were good.

### Sight and Hearing Tests

High School group eye tests were done by the School Nurse using the Snellen Eye Test Chart. Out of an enrollment of 190 students 15 failed on the sight test and were advised to consult an eye doctor for medical eye exam. These students were old enough to appreciate the need of good sight care and co-operated well with the nurse.

The teachers screened out the grade school children using the Snellen Eye Chart and all failures were retested by the School Nurse. Sixty-three grade school children were retested and where any degree of defect was found the parents were contacted and notified regarding the children's eye test. Fifteen Children were helped in various ways to obtain medical eye care.

The audiometer machine was used to test the hearing from the fourth grade group on through the High School grades. Over 500 tests were given and twelve students were apparent failures. These defects are followed up each year and medical care advised as needed. In the lower grades Watch tick tests and Whisper tests were used to grade the hearing ability. Three children were found with hearing difficulty, and the parents were notified of this condition.

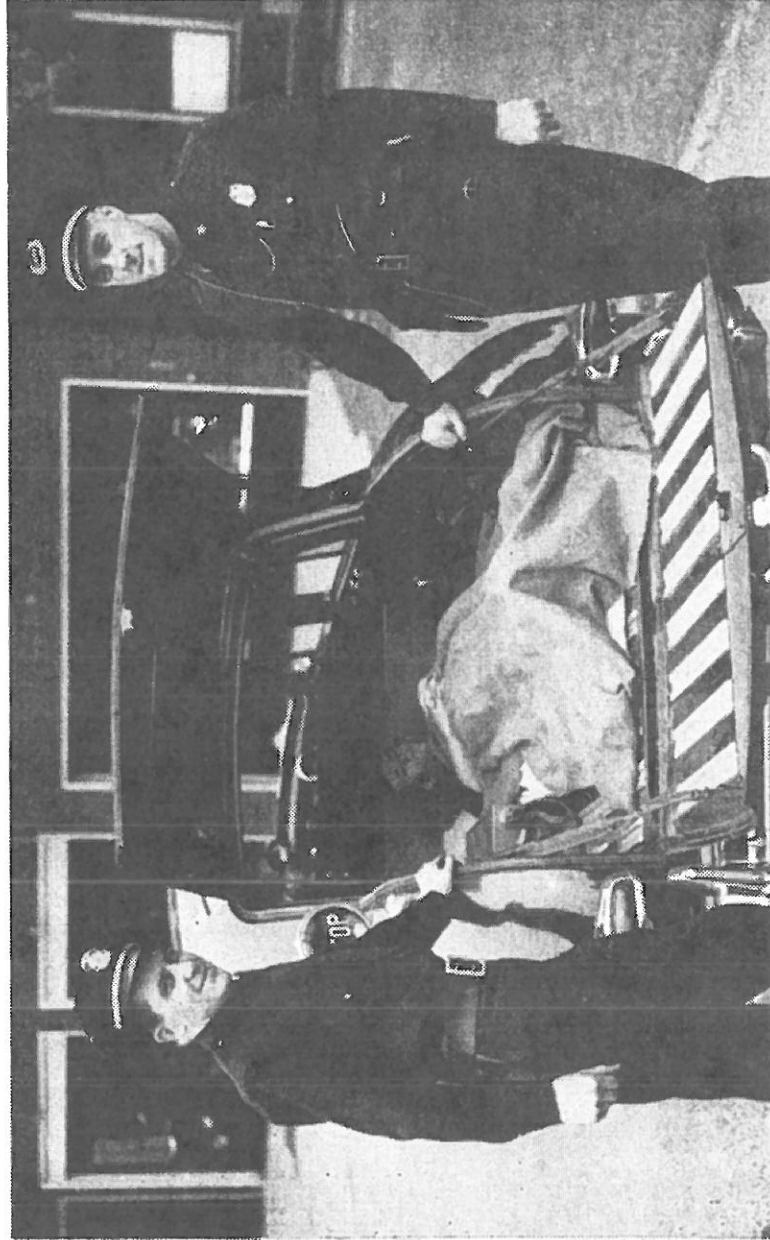

### PROTECTION OF PERSONS AND PROPERTY

#### Police Department

The record of arrests for 1950 shows a total of 304. These were for many and varied reasons as listed below. In addition 169 automobile accidents were reported and investigated. From April 25 to December 31, 1950 a total of 31 stretcher cases were taken to the hospital in the police car which can also double for an ambulance. This is an average of a little over 3 cases per month for the period the car has been in operation. It has aided the Police Department in giving greater service to the citizens of Old Orchard Beach. In addition the size of the schoolboy patrol has been tripled. Patrol boys now ride the school buses as an added safety feature. The Department wishes to commend the patrol for a job well done.

The department is now prepared to handle all cases of finger print indentification. Officer Higgins is a graduate of the Institute of Applied Science located in Chicago, Illinois. The department inspects all summer property frequently and notifies the owners of any irregularities they discover. Immediately following the storm last November these properties were inspected and the owners notified of any damage.
