Report of Superintendent of Schools

To the Superintending School Committee and Citizens of Old Orchard Beach:

The annual report of the public schools of Old Orchard Beach for the fiscal year ending December 31, 1957 summarizes in part the year in education at the national and local level and concludes with teacher, pupil, and financial statistics.

1957-A YEAR OF EDUCATIONAL CONFLICTS

Everyone seems to have an answer to what is wrong with the schools in America today. Little Rock, little moons and seemingly little education have confused and frightened many of the good people in the "Land of the Free and the Home of the Brave."

Let us make haste rather slowly and weigh carefully words from men with "Ivory Tower" status who generalize the errors of some into national problems.

It seems to me that the proof of an educational system is the kind of society it develops, the kind of a government it maintains, and the kind of health and happiness that abounds. Our standards of education are being compared with England and the European countries of Russia, Germany, and France. Shall we, in our thinking, move to these countries who have been so successful with their educational programs?

It is a belief that now the sun does set on Great Britain's soil. Have they not lost their great power and wealth as a leader among nations? May we not assume that the product of the German educational system had a part in starting World War I and World War II? And can we determine that Germany is happy today with its divided State under the police guard of three other countries? The so-called government of France is probably the result of a

disciplined educational program that might stand some masses know just enough to follow, is being elevated as a country whose educational system should be copied. "Life Adjustment" courses. And lastly Russia, who educates their leaders well and makes sure at the same time that the

The charges against education in this country in many instances are just and much good will come from national debates on the subject. We will have the kind of an education that the people of this country want. Time and circumstances change philosophies and presently we are going through the painful experience of developing a new philosophy to meet the needs of the challenge by Communism. Let's firm up our education in terms of our freedom and rights and not in terms that dictators have found to be expedient during their short span of life.

PROGRESS IN LOCAL SCHOOLS

Enrichment Program-Action was taken locally to improve the achievement curve for all elementary pupils and at the same time broaden the curricular offering and requirement for the fast learner. Some satisfaction has been gained in the knowledge that this movement was planned prior to the advent of the Russian Sputnik and in advance of national publicity relative to uneasiness in the American educational scene. The program at Old Orchard Beach has been good in the past largely due to the over-all excellence of the teaching staff and it is a hope, with this additional emphasis, to make a good program better. An effort is being made to reduce the number of individual differences per classroom and provide at the same time an opportunity for greater achievement in the 3 R's for each and every child. Classes have been regrouped, as far as possible, to reduce the range of from three or four progress groups in each class to as nearly two as possible. This was arranged in buildings having three or more classes of the same grade level with the purpose of permitting more pupils with similar abilities to gain educational experience together.

It is expected that the teaching will more closely ap-

proach the philosophy of developing maximum resources mentally, physically, socially, and esthetically. This means presenting an educational climate that is both challenging and stimulating to each ability group. Enrichment may be defined then as another way to emphasize the approach to meeting the child's individual need.

Objective—To develop the necessary primary skills in the following: 1. Skills in Creative Writing; 2. Skills in Reading to Remember; 3. Skills in Oral Reading; 4. Skills in Phonetic Spelling; 5. Skills in Practical Arithmetic.

All pupils are expected to learn the essentials of the above skills while quick learning pupils shall be held to an approach to mastering of these skills as all attempt to develop critical thinking and evaluation through exposure to a broad reading program.

At the high school level, emphasis is being placed on better guidance, class placement, and quality of work to the end that the high school diploma will become more meaningful as a standard of achievement.

Local pride and enthusiasm has been aroused in extracurricular activities during the past year especially in athletics. Old Orchard Beach High School has been outstanding particularly in basketball and football. The 1957 basketball team won the Southwestern Maine "M" School Championship. It was designated as the number 2 team in the state for its class on losing the State Championship game in the closing minutes at Waterville. The 1957 football team was undefeated and scored the hightest rating for teams in its class in the State. And lastly, Helen Fournier representing girls' athletics, gained fame for herself and school by becoming the foul shooting Champion of the State.

NEW TEACHERS

Although one new teaching position was created in the high school, the total over-all faculty of 46 remained the same as of last year since a replacement for Mrs. Lillian Lee in girls' physical education was unobtainable. Mr. Joseph Regina, former St. Louis High School teacher and coach of football, was assigned to a similar position in the high school due to increased enrollments. Following the resignation of Miss Mary Whitehurst who accepted a position with the Katherine Gibbs Secretarial School in New Jersey, Miss Ella Perry of Wollaston, Mass., an experienced teacher in the Commercial field, was engaged to complete the high school faculty with the exception of girls' Physical Education.

Four 1957 graduates of Gorham State Teachers' College and the University of Maine replaced an equal number of teachers who retired from active teaching. Anthony Tsomides of Saco, Miss Barbara Flanagan of Old Orchard Beach and Bernard Neveux of Biddeford received their education at Gorham, while Miss Julie Mahaney attended the University. Miss Flanagan and Miss Mahaney were assigned to the Elementary School following the retirement of Mrs. Augusta Monroe and Mrs. Stephen White after many years of service. Mr. Tsomides and Mr. Neveux accepted positions in the 8th and 7th grades respectively, in the Federal School, replacing Mr. King Bishop and Miss Mary Messenger.

Three additional experienced teachers were secured following the resignation of Mrs. Ella McKenna, Mrs. Bernadette Eagen and Mr. Ralph Dodge who resigned to leave the State. Mrs. Lula Ridlon of South Windham and Mrs. Leone Allen of South Portland were assigned to the Federal School and Mrs. Cordelia Brooks of Island Falls completed the faculty at the Jameson School.

Mrs. Gladys Sawyer of Old Orchard Beach substituted for Miss Alice McCarthy during the fall term while she was convalescing from an operation.

Once again the Old Orchard Beach schools were selected as a training center for an increasing number of practice teachers. The following from Gorham State Teachers' College have been assigned to the three elementary schools during the 1957-58 school year: Robert Corbeil, Nadia Estabrook and Claudette Morel.

Those trained in the high school this year include:

Richard Marshall of the University of Maine, Miss Alice Throumoulos of Nasson College, and Nicholas Zagorianakos of St. Aurelius College in New Hampshire.

SCHOOL MAINTENANCE

A schedule of repairs, cleaning, and painting was carried on in the usual manner by the regular school maintenance employees.

Special projects for the summer included: a new furnace in the Old High School as well as the installation of an additional toilet, a new front door entrance to the Elementary School, new stage curtains and drapes in the high school, new classroom shades in the Federal School, and a playground ground fill at the Jameson School.

Under the direction of Mr. Benjamin Downs, many thousands of cubic feet of fill were accepted from the State Road Contractor and used to build up a large play or parking area to the rear and left of the football field. Some of the fill was used, also, to complete the Jameson School grounds.

The unsafe wooden football stands were removed and replaced by modern portable steel stands with the help of local donations to the amount of \$335.00, secured under the direction of Mr. Robert Smith.

FINANCES

Unexpected credits and subsidy were received this year which developed a more favorable balance than usual. The figure of \$6259.94 is available to be used to reduce amounts necessary to be raised for 1958.

The Sinclair Bill passed after the annual March town meeting provided \$2992.00 more than was estimated. We were unable to employ one teacher as planned, another teacher was on part time, and \$2771.00 additional funds were received on a government application to Public Law 874.

Following a very worthwhile workshop for all teachers

on December 6, in which there was an unusual display of modern science textbooks, approval was granted to allocate \$300.00 of this extra government money to elementary building principals for selection of reading table reference books by their teachers. In like manner \$300.00 was granted for the use of high school science teachers for the purchase of science equipment to supplement their current needs.

School expenditures in Maine are still moving upward and will be reflected in the local school budget for 1958.

CONCLUSION

On closing this report I am reminded that no constructive solution regarding the providing of additional space for Home Economics and Industrial Arts has as yet been advanced. To this problem, we must add the fact that Physical Education facilities are totally inadequate for the size of the present enrollment in the high school.

There are re-organization plans possible under the new Sinclair Law which might reduce building needs in Old Orchard Beach for some period of time as well as strengthen the over-all educational program. In brief, the following is one of the possibilities under the Sinclair Act:

- 1. Form an Administrative District (Old Orchard Beach-Saco).
- 2. Change present high school to a junior high school (grades 7, 8, 9).
- 3. Contract with Thornton Academy (grades 10, 11, 12).

An additional long range planning suggestion for the benefit of education in this area, under this new law, would provide a new modern high school through the efforts of Saco and Old Orchard Beach. Thornton Academy, with its fine campus available, might then become a Junior College for students in this locality.

If such an Administrative District is formed, construction aid to the amount of 18 per cent of the costs would be provided by the state as well as an increase of 10 per cent of the Foundation Program subsidy.

These possibilities are presented for your consideration without recommendation. The way now seems clear for some long range planning as we attempt to meet present needs for a better day in education.

School Nursing Report 1957

To Superintendent of Schools C. J. Cutts:

We opened our year in school nursing for 1957 by continuing the classes started in the previous Fall term on health and hygiene topics with a group of High School Students. We had considerable discussion and reading on subjects of interest to the students—health matters pertaining to the individual and the responsibility of each one to himself, his school, his family and the community. These youngsters showed a good personal responsibility by helping generously on the polio clinics—by bringing in younger children, checking the name lists with the secretary, baby sitting for the mothers with two and three children, and helping in many ways on the whole clinic program.

We are pleased with the job done on the polio clinics during the past two years. During 1957, 1284 shots were given and during 1956, 1783 shots were given making a total of 3,067. On an overall picture we have covered all groups of children from infancy thru teen age as advised by the National Polio Foundation which promoted the polio service thru the Federal government after the Salk serum was discovered. Our thanks and appreciation for their work on the clinics goes to the following persons—Mrs. Jean Fitanides, Mrs. Diana Bird, Mrs. Doris Barth, Mrs. Noella Joncas, Mrs. Gertrude Milliken, Mrs. Helene Fowler and our School Doctor, Dr. Donald Skilling.

We continued our T.B. protection service thru 1957 with our Patch testing program given to all new students in all grade levels, the entire Junior Primary group, the eighth grade and the Senior High School class, plus any child that the State X-ray Clinic asked us to check. Eight children who had a question of T.B. contact and who had reacted Postively on the Patch test were x-rayed thru service from the York County T.B. Association. Fortunately,

these youngsters showed normal lung development on their x-rays.

Again thru 1957 we had help from the Sweetser Home staff thru Mr. Leighton Cheney, psychologist. Mr. Cheney was very helpful to us in evaluating various problems troubling some of our school children. Some 13 children and their parents were in contact with this service during the past year.

The Dental Clinic was limited during 1957 mainly because our Dental Hygienist, Mrs. Doris Homer, was unable to be with us as much as in previous years due to family illness.

The Eye Clinic service took care of the needs of 25 children during the past year. Our school clinic and the local Lions Club co-operated in helping these children.

Toxoid and vaccination clinics were held at the Town Hall regularly thru 1957 and children lacking this health protection were invited to take their "shots" or smallpox vaccination. We urged attendance thru the Fall term as during the previous year we had concentrated on wide-spread use of polio vaccine so now worked to catch up on any lack of the protection provided thru the triple shots and smallpox vaccination. It has been shown that areas in our country where these preventive measures were allowed to lapse in use diphtheria and smallpox have appeared which is utterly unnecessary today.

The Hot Lunch program as in other years was of good value to us thru 1957. The general business trend has been depressed in our town and nearby area and the lunch and milk program has been a good aid for families hard pressed financially in recent months.

During December of 1957 we had a new service added to our school program thru an advisory service by a Speech Therapist. Six children in the primary grades were examined during December and their parents were given advice concerning their special difficulty. Again we were appreciative of a new help in a problem area.

REPORT OF SCHOOL PHYSICIAN

To Mr. Cecil Cutts, Superintendent of Schools:

The examination of the students in our schools has been completed and with a minimum of absenteeism at the time. A total of eight hundred and seven were examined and only thirty eight were observed who possibly required some medical treatment.

The most explosive of any infections to date was that of the influenza last Fall, though the appearance of other contagious diseases, such as the measles, mumps and chicken pox has just started.

I believe that all the pupils and students in the school system have had the Salk vaccine except as I related last year the parents who did not wish it to be given. Those children of pre-school age have also received the vaccine.

Noteworthy is the appearance in this State of a standardized schedule or routine for examining the pupils in the school system. This calls for four examinations from the time they enter school until they have graduated from high school. I feel we are doing considerably better in Old Orchard now with an approximate eighty percent of the entire school system being examined every year. We are by no means perfect for I know the more extensive use of technical apparatus would increase our knowledge and possibly reveal abnormalities that now go unobserved.

I have had 219 complaints which have been investigated, and corrective action has been taken insofar as the law allowed.

I have called the State Inspectors in on two cases, and I have had the New England Sanitation System in on two cases.

REPORT ON ADVERTISING AND PUBLICITY

To the Honorable Board of Selectmen and Citizens of Old Orchard Beach, Maine

The year just passed has been especially rewarding for the business people and citizens of Old Orchard Beach and I feel, very sincerely that the expanded advertising and publicity program approved by your board has contributed greatly to the over-all economic prosperity of our community and should be continued in 1958.

I am equally confident, even more business can be brought to Old Orchard Beach by gearing our promotional efforts to reach the new markets that will bring this business during the coming year. Our cost of operation has been continually increasing, just as in any business during the past years. Recognizing this, I appeal for support for an appropriation that will allow us to carry out our program of newspaper advertising and publicity.

Now let us examine our record for 1957. Our appropriation of thirteen thousand dollars was expended as follows: Newspaper advertising—\$7,333.19, Town brochures—\$2,182.-82, Miscellaneous maps, publications and conventions—\$560.00, Maine Publicity Bureau—\$600.00, Fishing Survey—\$676.39, Bumper decals—\$175.00, Displays in Canada—\$99.65, Neon Signs and Sign at Kittery—\$230.83, Album of Photos, Town Listing—\$220.00, Postage and Secretarial help—\$179.85, Fireworks—\$550.00, Total expended—\$12,807.73, Balance on hand—\$192.27.

I again request the sum of thirteen thousand dollars with which to continue this program.

Results from newspaper advertising produced thousands of direct inquiries which were answered individually. In 1957, we advertised in twenty-three additional newspapers. We now possess an album of photos for use by newspapers and magazines in publicizing our resort. Our town brochures are eye catching and give a quick, complete

picture of what we have to offer the vacationist. Our fishing survey was our outstanding promotion in 1957, focusing much attention on our town. Twelve of the leading fishermen and members of the New England Outdoor Writers Association were in attendance including four members of the Fishing Hall of Fame. Hundreds of inches of free newspaper space was used by these outstanding writers expounding the friendliness and hospitality to be found at Old Orchard Beach. I have requested our town officials to invite the forty-eight governors to an All Governors Fishing Derby to be held August 15, 16, and 17th.

Membership in the Maine Publicity Bureau, which distributed much of our advertising literature, and our advertising in "Maine Invites You" has contributed greatly to the success of our program.

The Official Information Bureau was again entrusted to my supervision. I was ably assisted by Mrs. Rita Belair and Mrs. Doris Ellingwood. I wish to publicly express my thanks and appreciation for their cooperation.

The operational cost of the Information Bureau is paid by the membership of the Old Orchard Beach Chamber of Commerce. No monies appropriated by the town are used for administrative salaries.

Traffic records show that we routed to Motels, Hotels, Guest Homes, etc., 352 parties consisting of 1,253 persons averaging 3.6 persons per party for an average of 5.4 days. Over 61,000 pieces of literature and 2,000 bumper decals were distributed. 829 individuals traveling by car were routed to their destination and 1,357 road maps were given out.

Our attendance at travel shows in both the United States and Canada, where we had a twenty foot exhibit at the Hartford show and smaller exhibits at different locations in Montreal and Quebec City, drew much attention to our recreational advantages. We mailed in package form over 35,000 brochures to travel bureaus in the United States and Canada.

A new forty-two foot sign board painted in color has

been erected on the Inter-state highway at Kittery, directing traffic to our scenic coastal regions and to Old Orchard Beach.

I wish to express my personal thanks and appreciation to your Honorable Board, to our Town Manager, to our Chiefs of Police and Fire Departments, to the Director of Public Works and to the men and women under their supervision, to the members of the press and to James Cruickshank of the Harry Frost Advertising Agency, for their cooperation.

May I again emphasize the fact that we need every dollar we are requesting with which to advertise the finest of all beaches on the Atlantic coast. Our objectives must be retained on a broad basis, so that we may best serve all sections of our community. Continued cooperation by our citizens in serving on committee assignments will again prove helpful.

It is my belief that this community has enjoyed one of its most profitable seasons. Favorable weather plus a well balanced program was most helpful in attracting summer tourists.

Libby of the State Department of Audit. The audit analysis was on a basis consistent with that of the preceding year and included all procedures which were considered necessary in the circumstances.

Insofar as could be ascertained within the scope of the examination, the financial transactions of the Town were appropriately handled, with such exceptions as may be noted in the accompanying comments. Recommendations are offered which are believed worthy of consideration.

The financial and statistical sections, incorporated in this report, present the results of the Town's financial operations for the period indicated.

COMMENTS

TOWN OF OLD ORCHARD BEACH

JANUARY 1, 1957 TO DECEMBER 31, 1957

An audit of the financial records maintained by the various officers of the Town of Old Orchard Beach has been completed for the year ended December 31, 1957.

The examination included a review of cash transactions and an analysis of available funds and expenditures. The results are incorporated in the following text, exhibits and schedules.

The fiscal year's operations showed that available funds exceeded expenditures by \$7,454.26, per the following summary:

Departmental Operations:

The unappropriated balance of excise tax revenue, the overlay and supplemental taxes, and unexpended balances in various operating accounts were the principal factors contributing to the excess of available funds over expenditures. Overdrafts occurred for the most part in the indebtedness, abatement, contingent and street lights accounts.

ASSETS

The cash balance of \$25,522.85 was reconciled with statements furnished by the depository and count of cash on hand. The cash is segregated as follows:

Other assets were reviewed and unpaid accounts were reconciled with the balances shown on the records of the tax collector, treasurer and town manager. Verification was undertaken to determine the correctness of the outstanding accounts.

LIABILITIES

Insofar as could be determined the general fund liabilities amounted to \$11,646.48. This amount represented for the most part, accounts payable of \$7,450.40 and a demand note obligation of \$2,500.00 due the Old Orchard Beach Library.

DEFERRED REVENUE

Deferred revenue of \$4,072.43 carried forward to the ensuing year for allocation, consisted of 1958 excise tax collections of \$2,275.79, and parking meter revenue of \$1,796.64.

RESERVES AND SURPLUS

The appropriation accounts reflect net unexpended balances of \$37,573.63 at December 31, 1957. This amount represents unexpended balances in various operating accounts that are carried forward to the ensuing year in accordance with legal requirements, by vote of the townspeople, or authority of the municipal officials.

The unappropriated surplus amounted to \$70,627.58, a decrease of \$26,405.11 for the year. The change was caused principally by an authorized appropriation for debt retirement and the reappropriation of prior years' lapsed balances, less the excess of available funds over expenditures and a tax settlement.

DEBT FUND

The debt fund incorporated in the financial statement as a separate fund, reflects outstanding bonds and notes of \$250,500.00 and \$7,500.00 respectively, which are to be retired from future revenue.

CAPITAL RESERVE FUND

The capital reserve fund for fire equipment amounted to \$6,149.33 at the year end. This fund is represented by a time deposit of \$5,578.25 in the Saco and Biddeford Savings Institution and \$571.08 due from the general fund.

DEPARTMENTAL ACCOUNTS

Departmental operating accounts showed an increase of \$81,964.32 in funds raised by taxation as compared with the preceding year. Increases in protection, highway, education and unclassified accounts were the pricipal reasons for the change. A reduced appropriation for general government was also a factor.

The departmental balances carried forward to the ensuing year increased by \$35,874.96 as compared with the balances at the start of the year. The increase was reflected principally in the health and sanitation, highways and bridges, education, and municipal park acounts.

GENERAL

The review of the town clerk's record of the special town meeting July 1, 1957, revealed that the townspeople authorized the selectmen to pay land damages totaling \$3,000.00 in connection with the construction of the Saco Avenue side-

walk. These damages, as determined by the selectmen, are pending final settlement.

The town received \$4,000.00 during the current year as payment in full settlement of all liability under surety bonds executed by the Maine Bonding and Casualty Company, in behalf of tax collectors for the years 1950 through 1954. From the proceeds the town paid \$1,000.00 for legal services rendered in negotiating this settlement and the transaction is included in the contingent account. The remaining \$3,000.00 was credited to the unappropriated surplus account.

The voucher examination revealed that in some instances vendors' original invoices were not on file, and that payrolls were not on file to support all labor payments. It was further noted that \$600.00 had been advanced to various school principals for the purchase of supplies. Chapter 364, Section 45 of the Public Laws of 1937 provides in part that the Superintendent of Schools shall place all orders for materials and supplies purchased by vote of the committee or directors.

It also was noted that during the year federal excise taxes amounting to \$92.22 were paid to the City Service Oil Company on gasoline and oil deliveries.

The examination of the journal entries revealed that parking meter violation fines amounting to \$904.77 were transferred to the police department account. No town vote was found recorded substantiating this transfer.

Bonds and coupons maturing during the year were not paid until notification was received from the paying bank.

RECOMMENDATIONS

The following recommendations are believed worthy of consideration:

Payrolls and vendors' original invoices should be kept on file to substantiate all expenditures.

Transfer of revenue should be authorized by vote of the townspeople.

A bond and coupon bank account should be established, and deposits made to the acount prior to the maturity of the bonds and coupons. As these items are presented for payment they will be charged to the account by the bank. Any balance remaining in the account will be available to pay matured bonds and coupons when presented for payment.

SCOPE OF AUDIT

Count of cash was made and records checked to determine the accuracy of recording cash transactions. The system of internal control was reviewed as pertained to the handling of cash and other matters of financial concern.

External verifications were utilized on a test basis to

determine the correctness of recorded assets and liabilities.

Capital reserve fund transactions were examined. The savings account balance was verified by direct bank confirmation.

An analysis was made of the receipts and deposits as well as expenditures and bank charges. Vouchers, payrolls and canceled checks were examined for a selected period.

Excise tax collections were verified with the copies of the receipts retained by the collector. Education account balances were verified with the Superintendent of Schools. Bond coverage was reviewed.

The financial transactions of the Free Public Library were examined and the cash balance was reconciled with a statement furnished by the depository.

Various laws pertaining to the fiscal operations of the municipality were reviewed to determine that related financial transactions had been properly administered.

Included in this report are exhibits and schedules pertaining to the financial status of the town. Audit procedures were followed to the extent deemed necessary to develop these statements.

In our opinion, the accompanying statement of financial condition and supporting information present fairly the financial position of the town at December 31, 1957 and the results of its operations for the year then ended.

FREE PUBLIC LIBRARY

JANUARY 1, 1957 TO DECEMBER 31, 1957

An audit of the financial records of the Free Public Library has been completed for the year ended December 31, 1957.

The examination revealed that funds for current year operations amounted to \$8,079.66. This amount was comprised of a cash balance of \$354.74 from the preceding year, town appropriations of \$5,300.00, and other revenue of \$2,424.92. Expenditures of \$7,976.05 were principally for salaries, books and supplies, and purchase of a bond. The cash balance of \$103.61 at the year end was reconciled with a statement furnished by the York National Bank, Saco, Maine.

The Town of Old Orchard Beach was indebted to the Library at the year end for the balance of the 1957 appropriation of \$1,429.44 and note interest of \$43.75.



WARRANT

FOR ANNUAL TOWN MEETING

To Leo T. McDonald, a constable of the Town of Old Orchard Beach, in the County of York and the State of Maine.

GREETINGS:

In the name of the State of Maine, you are hereby required to notify and warn the inhabitants of said Town of Old Orchard Beach, qualified to vote in town affairs, to assemble at the High School in said Old Orchard Beach on Monday, the Third day of March, A. D. 1958, at 9 o'clock in the forenoon, then and there to act on the following articles, to wit:

Article 1 To choose a Moderator to preside at said meeting.

Article 2. To hear and act on the report of the Selectmen and other town officials.

Article 3. To choose all necessary town officers for the ensuing year.

Article 4. To see if the Town will vote that the net surplus as of December 31, 1957, be appropriated to the Reserve for Uncollected Taxes.

Article 5. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money to be used for decorating graves on Memorial Day, under the direction of the American Legion.

Budget Committee recommends the sum of \$50.00.

Article 6. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for defraying the expenses of the Memorial Day parade and exercises, under the direction of the Memorial Committee.

Budget Committee recommends the sum of \$196.00.

Article 7. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate to defray the expense of Town Administration for the year 1958.

The Budget Committee recommends that \$16,415.00 be appropriated; that the salary of each selectman be \$75.00; the salary of each assessor be \$75.00; and the salary of the Town Clerk be \$2,000.00 annually, and be paid from the appropriation for administration.

Article 8. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the hire of an experienced Assistant Assessor; and for clerical assistance for the assessors.

Budget Committee recommends \$2,450.00.

Article 9. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for planting flowers and trees, in various sections of Town. Said sum to be expended with the approval of the Park Commission and the Town Manager. Budget Committee recommends \$392.00.

Article 10. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for heating, lighting, and general maintenance of the Town Hall.

Budget Committee recommends \$5,855.00.

Article 11. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Civil Defense and Public Safety.

Budget Committee recommends \$490.00, and that any unexpended balance be carried forward as a credit balance in the following year.

Article 12. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$195,008.00, for schools to be divided as follows: Common schools, \$103,964.00; high school, \$48,764.00; textbooks, \$5,000.00; repairs, \$4,200.00; supplies, \$5,000.00; maintenance (utilities, insurance, equipment), \$8,758.00; industrial arts, \$4,102.00; home economics, \$3,775.00; physical education, \$6,133.00; medicalhealth (school physician, dental hygienist, dentist, optometrist), \$1,343.00; school committee, \$225.00; supervision, \$2,930.00; high school conveyance, \$814.00.

Budget Committee so recommends.

Article 13. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Superintending School Committee to appoint a school physician.

Budget Committee so recommends.

Article 14. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the Public Works' Department, including highways and bridges, snow removal, surfacing, sewers and drains, sanitation, maintenance of town dump, maintenance of town team, and maintenance of sidewalks.

Budget Committee recommends, highways and bridges, \$15,680.00 from Excise Taxes; snow removal, \$9,800.00, (\$4,000.00 from Excise Taxes and the balance from general taxation); surfacing, \$12,740.00; sewers and drains, \$7,350.00; sanitation, \$22,540.00; town dump, \$7,350.00; town team, \$3,381.00; maintenance of sidewalks, \$2,450.00.

Article 15. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the purchase of a new 2½ ton truck for the Highway Department, with Spreader.

Budget Committee recommends \$4,410.00.

Article 16. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the purpose of paying valid outstanding indebtedness of the Town.

Budget Committee recommends \$29,250.00; (\$1,500.00 from park-

ing lot income, balance from general taxation.)

Article 17. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate to pay interest on notes and bonds for the year 1958.

Budget Committee recommends \$11,000.00. (\$195.00 from parking

lot income, balance from general taxation.)

Article 18. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for street lights.

Budget Committee recommends \$18,600.00.

Article 19. To see if the Town will vote to ratify, approve and confirm the action of the Town Manager in executing and delivering to Central Maine Power Company a contract dated April 1, 1957, for a term of ten (10) years,

or any extension thereof, covering street lighting service in said Town in accordance with the provisions set forth in said contract, which contract as executed is to be submitted to the meeting for approval.

Budget Committee so recommends.

Article 20. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for new street lights at the following locations:

Near 70 Hampton Ave. at the northeasterly end of Ninth Street.

Near 54 Tioga Avenue at the southeasterly end.

At the corner of Summit Street, and so called North Street. One on Sunset Avenue.

At the entrance to the Federal School.

At each entrance to the Jameson School (two lights requested.)

Budget Committee recommends \$126.00.

Article 21. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for life-guard service for the year 1958.

Budget Committee recommends \$6,370.00 for life-guard service.

Article 22. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate to clean the streets and the beach, including the Town's share of the cost of cleaning Temple Ave., and Ocean Park Beach.

Budget Committee recommends \$10,682.00.

Article 23. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate to maintain the Police Department for the year 1958.

Budget Committee recommends \$32,181.40. (\$31,360.00, from general taxation and \$821.40 from parking fines.)

Article 24. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the purchase of a new police car.

Budget Committee recommends \$1,470.00.

Article 25. To see what sum of money the Town will

vote to raise and appropriate for parking meter enforcement, parking meter maintenance, painting curbs, and the purchase and installation of traffic signs.

Budget Committee recommends \$1,000.00 for parking meter enforcement; \$600.00, for parking meter maintenance; \$500.00, for painting curbs; and \$1,000.00, for traffic signs. (The total of \$3,100.00 to be taken from parking meter income.)

Article 26. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the improvement of the Milliken Street parking lot.

Budget Committee recommends \$735.00, from parking meter in-

come.

Article 27. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Contingent Expense. Budget Committee recommends \$6,860.00.

Article 28. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate to pay the salary of the License Inspector, namely Mr. Fred I. Luce.

Budget Committee recommends \$1,000.00, from Licenses Income.

Article 29. To see if the Town will vote to amend Chapter XI of the By-Laws as revised and adopted on May 11, 1925, and amended by vote of March 7, 1927; by adding the following subsection, to be known as Section Ia. "Section Ia. All licenses and permits granted under this Chapter shall expire on the first day of May, next following the date of issuance of same."

Budget Committee so recommends.

Article 30. To see if the Town will vote to instruct the Selectmen to prepare and submit to the Legislature a bill, amending the present Civil Service Act, so as to include the Police Department.

Article 31. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the salary and travel expense of the Health Officer.

Budget Committee recommends \$500.00, for salary; \$88.00, car

expense.

Article 32. To see what sum of money the **Town** will vote to raise and appropriate for Health Nursing Service, and Immunization.

Budget Committee recommends \$5,130.00 for Health Nursing Service; and \$294.00, for Immunization.

Article 3S. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Public Assistance.

Budget Committee recommends \$9,800.00.

Article 34. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Aid to Dependent Children.

Budget Committee recommends \$1,372.00.

Article 35. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate to assist the Library Association.

Budget Committee recommends \$6,860.00.

Article 36. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the Town's share of Social Security payments for 1958.

Budget Committee recommends \$3,500.00.

Article 37. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Workmen's Compensation, and unallocated insurance.

Budget Committee recommends \$2,300.00.

Article 33. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Park Commission to operate the public parking area for hire during the season 1958, and to pay over to the Town Treasurer daily all receipts. Disbursements to be made by the Treasurer upon approved vouchers signed by a majority of the Park Commission and approved by the Board of Selectmen as prescribed in the Revised Statutes of 1954.

Article 39. To see if the Town will vote to authorize any unexpended balance in the Parking Lot Income account, so called, for the year 1958, to be carried over into the same account for the year 1959.

Article 40. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for hydrant rental for the year 1958.

Budget Committee recommends \$32,680.12.

Article 41. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate to maintain the Fire Department for the year 1958.

Budget Committee recommends \$28,420.00.

Article 42. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money to employ an assistant Fire Inspector for the ensuing year.

Article 43. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen and Town Treasurer to deposit an amount equal to the unexpended balance in the Fire Department account at the close of the 1958 fiscal year, in the Town of Old Orchard Beach Capital Reserve Fund, known as the Fire Department Major Equipment Account.

Article 44. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for advertising purposes for the year 1958.

Budget Committee recommends \$12,740.00; (\$5,000.00 from Licenses Income, the balance from general taxation.)

Article 45. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate to complete the Colby Avenue sewer project.

Budget Committee recommends \$2,940.00.

Article 46. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate to cover the brook on West Grand Avenue, from Randall Avenue easterly to the dike, a distance of approximately 50 feet.

Budget Committee recommends \$1,274.00.

Article 47. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for membership in the Maine Municipal Association.

Article 48. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to grant a 1% discount on taxes paid within one month from commitment.

Budget Committee does not recommend.

Article 49. To see what sum, if any, the Town will vote to raise and appropriate to carry out the purpose of Article 48.

Article 50. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Mosquito and Moth Control.

Budget Committee recommends \$2,352.00.

Article 51. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the observance of the 75th Anniversary of the Town.

Article 52. To see if the Town will vote to take by eminent domain proceedings for use as a public way a certain portion of land situated in Old Orchard Beach, being that strip of land 25 feet in width lying between Scollard Road, so called, and the beach, the sidelines of said strip being the extended sidelines of said Scollard Road as it now appears.

Article 53. To see what sum, if any, the Town will vote to raise and appropriate to pay for damages incurred in the taking of land by eminent domain proceedings as proposed by the foregoing article.

Article 54. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the construction of an 8 inch sewer pipe line, 220 feet long, on Aldine Terrace.

Budget Committee recommends \$1,294.00.

Article 55. To see if the Town will vote to reimburse Stanley Leonard the sum of \$694.30, for a sewer that he installed on St. John St. for a distance of 163 feet, to connect with the existing manhole on that street. The then termination of the public sewer.

Budget Committee recommends \$680.00.

Article 56. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for a sidewalk on the easterly side of Francis Street, to run from the back of the Imperial Hotel to the corner of Bradbury Street. A distance of approximately 700 feet; estimated cost of \$750.00.

Budget Committee makes no recommendation.

Article 57. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money to gravel and pave Odena Avenue, from Seaside Avenue, easterly, for approximately one block.

Budget Committee recommends \$588.00.

Article 58. To see what sum, if any, the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for new hydrants at the following locations:

Near 70 Hampton Ave. at the northeasterly end of Ninth Street.

Near 54 Tioga Avenue at the southeasterly end.

Near the Ocean Park Garage on Oceana Avenue.

Hydrant installations for the Millikens Mills area.

Article 59. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for repairing the ditch near the Boston and Maine Depot in Railroad Square.

Budget Committee recommends \$490.00.

Article 60. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate to build a storm sewer on Fifth Street, from Union Avenue to Prospect Street.

Article 61. To see if the Town will vote to accept as Public Ways the following streets, and extensions, as laid out by the Selectmen:

Ext. Ninth Street, northeasterly, 175 feet.

Ext. Tioga Avenue, southeasterly, 75 feet.

Ext. Casco Avenue, northwesterly, 50 feet.

Reserve Avenue, from Ocean Park Road, northeasterly, 345 feet.

7 Knoll Avenue, from Cascade Road, 500 feet.

7 Thistle Avenue, from Cascade Road, 500 feet.

Article 62. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate to grade and gravel the following streets, and extensions:

Article 63. To see what sum, if any, the Town will vote to raise and appropriate to grade and gravel Francis Street, from Bradbury Street to Foote Street; and Foote Street, from Hoffman Street to Francis Street.

Budget Committee does not recommend.

Article 64. To see what sum, if any, the Town will vote to raise and appropriate to clear brush from the marsh adjoining Foote Street, Wesley Blvd., and Francis Street, to eliminate a fire hazard.

Budget Committee does not recommend.

Article 65. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for State Aid Road Construction (in addition to the amounts regularly raised for the care of highways and bridges), under the provisions of Section 44, 49, or 50, Chap. 23 R. S. 1954 amended.

Budget Committee recommends \$3,730.00.

Article 66. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the completion of the work on Sunset Drive. Estimated that \$1,300.00 will be necessary to complete project.

Article 67. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,200.00 for a pipe line to the dump. (To reduce fire hazard.)

Article 68. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to appoint a new By-Laws Committee.

Article 69. To see if the Town will vote to amend Chapter VI, Section 4, of the By-Laws as revised and adopted on the 11th day of May, 1925, and further amended by vote on March 7, 1927, to include Horses and ponies, said amended section to read as follows:

"Section 4. No person shall without a license from the local Board of Health, keep on his premises, or have in his possession, pigs at any time, and no person shall, without license, keep hens, ducks, geese, fowl, horses or ponies, of any kind. Licenses for above purposes may be granted by the local Board of Health for such period not exceeding one year as said Board deems proper and notice of application therefor shall be posted in two or more conspicuous and public places and in the vicinity of the location thereof, at least seven days before hearing of said application. Such license at any time may be revoked by local Board of Health and license granted by said Board shall become void and of no effect upon such revocation and notice of same to licensee."

Article 70. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$82.50 to reimburse the estate of Howard M. Robinson for over-payment of taxes for the years 1952 through 1956.

Article 71. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate to extend the sidewalk on Temple Avenue, from the present walk towards the intersection of Saco Avenue, approximately 300 feet.

Budget Committee recommends \$735.00.

Article 72. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate to repair the Goosefare Brook crossing.

Budget Committee recommends \$245.00.

Article 73. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate to rebuild the sidewalk on the south side of School Street, from beyond Lord's driveway to the American Legion Hall. (Approx. 300 feet.)

Budget Committee recommends \$735.00.

Article 74. To see what sum, if any, the Town will vote to raise and appropriate to repair, or replace, the boardwalk at the foot of Old Orchard Street, extending to Staples Street. (Estimated cost of \$1,200.00 to replace lumber, plus the cost of labor.)

Budget Committee makes no recommendation.

Article 75. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money to grade and gravel Wesley Ave.

Article 76. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the installation of one street light on Pole No. J-30 East Grand Avenue, adjacent to the Alouette Motel.

Article 77. To see if the Town will vote that moving pictures may be shown on Sundays, in accordance with the Revised Statutes of Maine.

Article 78. To see if the Town will vote to fix a date when taxes shall be due and payable, and to fix a rate of interest to be charged on taxes after said date.

Budget Committee recommends that taxes be due July 1st, and that interest of 6% be charged on and after October 1st.

Article 79. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen and Treasurer to sell and dispose of property acquired by tax process, on such terms as they deem advisable and for the best interest of the Town, and to execute quit-claim deeds for the same, or any action relative thereto.

Article 80. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to appoint a Budget Committee.

Article 81. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Budget Committee to act in an advisory capacity to the Board of Selectmen and Town Manager, and to meet with said Board and Manager at convenient intervals.

Article 82. To see if the Town will vote to authorize

the Selectmen to employ the State Auditing Department for the year 1958, and that a mid-year inspection of the Town's financial affairs be made by that Department.

Article 83. To see if the Town will vote to go on Day light Saving Time for the summer months.

Article 84. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen and Town Treasurer to procure a temporary loan or loans in anticipation of taxes for the current municipal year for the purpose of paying indebtedness of the Town due and to become due during such current municipal year: such loan or loans not to exceed in the aggregate the total tax levy of the preceding municipal year and to be paid during the current municipal year out of money raised during such current municipal year by taxes.

The Selectmen will be in session at the Town Hall on Thursday, Friday, and Saturday, February 27, 28, and March 1st, from 2 to 5 P.M., and on Friday evening, February 28, from 7 to 9 P.M., for the purpose of registering new voters and correcting the voting list.

The polls will be open on the day of said meeting from 9 A.M. to 7 P.M.
