# Town Manager's Report

<u>**Tax Bills:**</u> will soon be mailed out. The mil rate is \$11.40 (\$12.24), a decrease of almost 7%, which is always good news. However, property values continue to increase based on market trends and reported sales. The Median Single Family Residential values increased about 12%, so that means:

- The Median single family residential value was \$339,000 last year at the mil rate of \$12.24 = \$4,149
- The Median single family residential value for this year is \$381,100 at a mil rate of \$11.40 = \$4,345

An increase of \$196

Also, for those senior citizens who applied and were eligible for the Property Tax Stabilization Program, enacted last year, your tax bill will remain the same as last year, even if the value of your property increases this current tax year.

This program will only be in effect the FY 24 tax bill because the State Legislature repealed this law effective October 11, 2023. Though wellintentioned, there were flaws with the program where it did not target relief to those who needed it most. It did not include income limits or limits on property value. As a result of repealing the Tax Stabilization Program, two existing State Programs that benefit low-income senior citizens have been expanded in its place:

- Property Tax Fairness Credit Program for eligible residents 65 and older increased from \$1500 to \$2000 as a refund of property taxes paid.
- Property Tax Deferral Program increased the income limits to be eligible from \$40,000 to \$80,000. This program works like a reverse mortgage. (where taxes are paid if the home is sold or it becomes part of an estate)

These State programs are administered by Maine Revenue Services and not the Town.

In addition to this there is also the Town's Senior Property Tax Assistance Program, that has been in place for the past 5 years. The Town administers this program where it provides property tax relief to eligible Old Orchard Beach residents.

<u>The Traffic Study</u> on Ocean Park Rd from the I195 spur to the Halfway Intersection continues. Gorrill Palmer, the engineering firm conducting the study, has prepared a draft traffic report for ME DOT's feedback on recommendations. After evaluating the traffic volumes for seasonal variations where traffic is significantly higher in the summer months and lower in the non-summer months, two general alternatives have risen to the top: The roundabout alternative, which includes roundabouts at the intersection of I195 or the spur and at the Halfway Intersection, however, the Smithwheel intersection would remain unsignalized. The other is a signal alternative, which includes fully functional traffic signals at three intersections:

- 1. Interstate 195 at the spur
- 2. Smithwheel Road
- 3. Halfway Intersection

Maine DOT typically requires evaluations to be completed for the 6th highest week of the year, which is during the peak summer months. They are reviewing the scenarios to ensure mobility through the corridor.

If you recall the temporary demonstrations that ME DOT proposed on Ocean Park Rd. for traffic calming efforts were to be installed in July, but there has been a lengthy delay in the procurement of goods, and we may have missed the window for the demonstration.

The schedule for the next public meeting was also pushed out to ensure ME DOT's full review of the alternatives beforehand. As soon as I receive an update on the next steps I will follow up with Council.
