by adding the underscored language and deleting the strikethrough language. These amendments propose changes to comply with the state housing opportunity program law (LD 2003) to allow for additional density for affordable housing developments in certain areas, multiple dwelling units on lots designated for housing, and one accessory dwelling unit located on the same lot as a single-family dwelling unit in any area housing is permitted.

Chair: Shawn O'Neill

Chairman O'Neill opened the hearing at 7:00 pm

Associate Planner Mike Foster gave a quick presentation on LD 2003 covering the history of the new law and town compliance with the changes. He continued by answering Council questions from the last public hearing.

Councilor Tousignant – asked the associate planner about ADU requirements and setback requirements including the variance procedure. Councilor Tousignant would still like the residents to vote on accepting the state law or not. He expressed his concerns on the density allowances as well. Chairman O'Neill – sad that it came upon Council so quickly – Councilor Tousignant – initially presented for locations 10,000 residents or more, dropped towards

the end of the process – asked local state level representatives to attend the meeting – not present.

Guy Fontaine – Old Salt Road – Difference between Charter and Zoning changes – wanted to confirm that ADUs can be allowed on non-conforming lots as long as they don't increase the non-conformity.

Councilman Rague read a resident letter and expressed his thoughts on state law.

Eileen Charbonneau – Gables Way – Do ADUs require related residents? – Town Manager Asanza – current ordinance restricts that – legacy ordinances on ADUs remain in place.

Chairman O'Neill thanked staff and residents for coming out and participating in the public hearing on such a complicated topic.

Town Manager's Report

New Salt Road: Bids for the New Salt Road reconstruction project are in and two bids were received. Shaw Bros of Gorham submitted the low bid of \$265,020, and Crooker Construction from Topsham submitted a bid of \$494,765. The bids have been reviewed by the engineer, and we will place this on the January 16th agenda for Council consideration. The project is anticipated to be funded by FEMA under the disaster relief fund from the December 2022 storm and this project is scheduled to be completion by early May 2024.

<u>Senior Tax Assistance Program</u>: For those eligible residents that applied for the Town's senior tax assistance program, checks were mailed December 20th, and for those that chose to have the amount credited to their tax bill, the Tax Dept has applied the credit to this year's tax bill. However, there is a change to this year's program due to the total number of the applications received, and the available funds appropriated.

Normally the Town's program would match \$ for \$ to what the applicant received from the State's Property Tax Fairness Credit program. But because we received applications that exceeded the amount budgeted of \$25,000, the amount applicants received had to be prorated accordingly. Applications for this program are due annually by November 1st, of each year, and the applications are available on the Town's website or directly from the Tax or Assessing departments.

It's important to mention that along with the Town's Senior Property Tax Assistance Program this year, Senior Citizens were also eligible for the State of Maine's Property Tax Stabilization Program, which allowed seniors 65 and older to freeze their tax bill at last year's tax bill amount. This program is only in effect for this year's real estate tax bill

because as of July 6, 2023, Maine Legislature repealed this bill effective October 11, 2023.

For this fiscal year Senior Citizens were eligible for three different types of tax relief programs: the State's Property Tax Fairness Credit Program, the Town's Senior Property Tax Relief Program, and the newly implemented (albeit for 1 year) State Property Tax Stabilization Program for Senior Citizens. If you have any questions on any of these programs, please reach out to either the Assessing Department or the Tax Department.

<u>Thursday's Workshop:</u> This Thursday Council will hold a workshop here at 6:00 pm to discuss the Capital Improvement Roadway Paving Project and the status of the Adult Use Marijuana Application Process.

This fiscal year Council appropriated funds from undesignated fund balance to address roadway paving in Town. Public Works has been working with the Town's engineer to research and prioritize the roads in need of repairs. At the workshop we will present these findings to Council so that we can finalize the list of roads to then develop a bid package.

The other topic that will be discussed at the workshop will be the status of the Adult Use Retail Marijuana Application Process.

<u>Transfer Station</u> is still open and will remain open till Saturday January 6^{th} for leaves, brush and Christmas Tree disposal. Tomorrow it will be open from 8-2:30 and Saturday from 8-3pm. It has remained open a little later this year than usual, because of the milder weather we've had, however this Saturday will be the last day till re-opens in the spring.

<u>Snow Parking Bans</u>: As a reminder since snow is forecasted for this Sunday, parking bans may be forthcoming. During winter storm parking bans off-street parking is available at Milliken Parking Lot, Memorial Parking Lot, and Ocean Park Square.

The Town uses several outlets to notify residents, like local television and radio stations, as well as the Town's website and electronic signs. You can also sign up to receive email notifications on winter parking bans by going to the Town's website and click on "Subscribe to News".
