20.	Elections		Election Day was Tuesday, November 4 th . There were 3,538 voters that participated in the election. For member of the Town Council, vote for two for two-year terms—One candidate turned in nomination papers and was placed on the ballot, Connor Rague. The other position was elected by write-in. Connor Rague was the successful candidate on the ballot, 2,378; Jay Kelley won the second seat as a write-in with 680 votes. Question 1, an Order to Authorize the Town of Old Orchard Beach to issue General Obligation bonds in the principal amount not to exceed \$1,200,000 to acquire a new Sutphen Fire Truck was adopted—2096 yes, 86 no, 651 blanks. For RSU #23 Board of Directors, vote for one for a three-year term; Barbara Roberge, 2685; write-ins 86 and blanks 766—Barbara Roberge being the successful candidate.

New for January 2024 is the ongoing absentee ballot process. Voters can also now register to vote or make changes online, and we check that daily, as well.	There were 33 new voters to Town from out-of-state or eligible to vote; 53 new voters from other municipalities in Maine; in addition, 19 voters changed their address within the Town; 9 voters had a name change; 6 voters changed their party; 0 voters were moved from inactive to active; 38 voters moved out of Town; 0 were cancelled, moved within State but didn't register in another Town; 4 voters moved out of State; 0 cancelled by SOS for being inactive for two general elections; 0 voters were removed as deceased; 0 voters moved to inactive; 3 voters moved out of town and then moved back and re-registered in OOB; 0 voters requested to be removed from the voting list; 0 requested to be returned to the voting list after having been asked to be removed; 1 voter moved back from UOCAVA or changed status (out of country or military). 0 voters added/removed their P.O.
